



The refurbishment of a typically English country pub and grade II listed building called for some interesting design and planning. Working alongside the owner who was a builder himself and acting as main contractor, Little Duffy designed and delivered the fitout of the kitchen and equipment along with the major fixtures and fittings to the bar and restaurant.

Planning dictated that none of the ventilation system could protrude beyond the existing lines of the building, so we built the ductwork and plant into an acoustically insulated stud wall running adjacent to the exterior wall of the building.

The kitchen had some interesting spaces and bespoke stainless tabling and hot and cold pass made best use of the available area.

In keeping with the surroundings, we designed and installed a handmade oak bar. Solid oak tops and fronts with a stop

chamfer detail. Laminate undershelfing and stainless steel glasswash station and sink to one end, and a back bar unit with 2 double door fridges and a stepped display for the spirits completed the bar.
